R. Spaulding moved to allow the school to hire someone to put the antenna back on the water tower and would be responsible for removal and replacement for any future maintenance needs per the Village. The Village will not charge a lease fee but the school would need to have their own electrical meter, seconded by B. Balkema. Motion carried.

H. Coy moved to have the Village submit a letter of intent to apply for grant funding from the State of Michigan 2023 Fire Equipment Grant Program, seconded by B. Balkema. Motion carried.

D. Swartz moved to accept the bid from Efficiency Production in the amount of \$2,379.30 for the purchase of 6 24" x 48" panels for the ends of our trench box, seconded by H. Coy. Motion carried.

The Council discussed residents parking on the water shut-offs and N. Roberts is going to put a copy of our current ordinance in the Village Newsletter, M. Bassett and C. Musser will start marking known shut-offs that are being parked on as they can. They also discussed the single axle ordinance, N. Roberts and M. Pennington are going to check to see what it would cost to have Republic (the only garbage company with a single axel garbage truck) contracted to do Village wide resident garbage pick-up and once-twice per year large item pick-up and possibly do away with Spring Clean-Up every other year. The Council discussed the possibility of giving or selling the Keehne Environmental Center to Eaton Co. At this time, they do not think that it would be in the Village's best interest to do so. The Council also discussed the school using the Village parks as school bus stops and the parks are being vandalized and litter is being thrown everywhere. It was decided that a letter will be written to the Superintendent and School Board to make sure that they are aware of the issue first and see if they can resolve the issue.

H. Coy moved to adjourn the meeting at 8:39 p.m., seconded by D. Swartz. Motion carried.
