B. Balkema moved to accept the original proposal from Night Magic Fireworks on July 4th, 2023 in the amount of \$6,200, seconded by L. Fulcher. Motion carried.

D. Swartz moved to make a resolution to add a Consumer's Light Pole at the end of E. Ellsworth St for the cost of \$100, seconded by B. Balkema. Motion carried.

S. Roberts moved to sell the Dodge Charger police car in the amount of \$5,000, seconded by D. Swartz. Motion carried.

Public Comment: Jim Mott stated that Eaton Co was awarded a grant in the amount of \$10 million dollars to add on to the Juvenile Detention Center in Charlotte. Eaton Co. was also awarded a \$1.5 million dollar class action lawsuit against local opioid suppliers. The money must be spread over 15 years. The parks millage passed and Eaton Co. would like to know if the Village would want to transfer Kheene Park to them instead of the county leasing it. N. Roberts asked if the homeowners on Capital Ave. would be able to purchase the property behind their homes that is currently part of the park but is being maintained by the homeowners. Jim said that he did not think that would be a problem.

The council discussed the ordinance 109-12 and 109-15 in regards to a safety hazard and public nuisance tree on 205 W. Caroline St. The tree is dead and large branches continue to break off hitting the power lines. It has taken the power out three different times in the last two-three years. The council would like the village to pursue this, giving the homeowner 60 days to comply. N. Roberts will send the letter out later this week.
