The council would like N. Roberts to ask Chief Jordon from the Fire Department for a key to decipher the incident type on the department reports. DDA cancelled their meeting because there was not enough to make quorum. Planning Commission plans on meeting in early August.

The council would like to wait to make any decisions on the WWTP project until after N. Roberts has her meeting with the USDA about funding. They would like Brad from Wightman and F. Hamman to attend to the meeting on July 27, 21.

N. Roberts discussed Roll Call voting that there should be a motion and have it voted on by the council if it is going to be done for everything that needs to be voted on. No motion was made.

N. Roberts discussed that additions to the Agenda that require a vote need to be added and the current agenda amended at the beginning of the meeting and no added at the end. If there is one that comes up after the agenda has been approved then the voting needs to be tabled until the next meeting.

H. Coy moved to have Collins Tree Service remove the tree and grind the stump at 404 W. Capital Ave for the amount of \$1,300, seconded by R. Miller. Motion passed with Roll Call vote: D. Swartz, H. Coy, T. Davis, R. Miller, D. Miller, K. Winright and M. Goodrich- Yay.

The council discussed the sidewalk ordinance and at this time no changes have been suggested. N. Roberts is checking with MDOT on which fund the sidewalks on S. Main St. should be paid out of when they are replaced.

The council discussed a possible agreement between the Village and M. Goodrich about the parking lot behind 129 N Main St. M. Goodrich stated that he would take down the sign that state that it's private parking and let the public park there if the Village provides snow removal and seals it. M. Goodrich also stated that if an agreement is not reached then he will block travel through the west end of his

parking lot. This is also contingent on the Methodist Church moving their handicapped parking spot to a different location so traffic can flow through without backing up. The council plans on meeting in the parking lot sometime down that road once the mosquitos are better.

R. Miller would like to see traffic flow during events like the street dance, car show and tractor show to be directed down W. Capital to Pease Rd to Love Rd instead of through town. This is especially for semi's as one got hung up on power lines during the last event and several people were without power.

T. Davis wanted to know about the council getting compost keys again. N. Roberts explained that it was not a good idea since we have a problem with people putting things at the site that do not belong there as it is. Now we can track this with the check out log but that would be impossible if those keys were given out.

M. Goodrich would like to create an ordinance to make it illegal for semi's to use their Jake brakes in the Village limits.

T. Davis asked about some brush at the end of Williams St. by the railroad tracks. N. Roberts will check to see who is responsible to clean it up.

N. Roberts let the council know that D. Burkett has turned in his notice of retirement and his last day will be Oct 15, 2021.

D. Swartz moved to adjourn the meeting at 8:36 p.m., seconded by R. Miller. Motion carried with Roll call vote: D. Swartz, H. Coy, T. Davis, D. Miller, K. Winright and M. Goodrich and R. Miller- Yay.
