## Summer Festivals, Activities, & Events

**Independence Day**—Enjoy the fireworks show hosted by the Bellevue Firemen's Association, partnered with TWC Concrete Construction, on July 4th to celebrate Independence Day. This is a long-standing tradition in our community, and everyone has a good time. Live music will be provided by Countryside Armory and Hoffman AgService, LTD., featuring Cairlynne Curtis and Justin Judge. There will also be several food trucks to satisfy your hunger. The live music starts at 7:00 p.m., and fireworks will begin at dusk on the athletic fields near West St. The show lasts approximately 15 minutes, and parking is free and plentiful.

The public may use fireworks only on the day before, the day of, and the day after a national holiday. In this case, fireworks are allowed on July 3, 4, and 5. However, fireworks may be used only between 7 a.m. and midnight on these days. When using fireworks, it is essential to be considerate of your neighbors. The loud bangs can be disruptive and cause discomfort for some community members. By being mindful of this, we can foster a harmonious neighborhood and respect each other's comfort.
