Council Minutes

President M. Goodrich called the meeting of the Bellevue Village Council to order at 7:00 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America. This meeting was at Bellevue Village Hall.

Roll Call:

Present: M. Goodrich, R. Miller, K. Winright, H. Coy, D. Swartz and T. Davis. D. Miller – Absent

Special Meeting for the 2021 Tax Milage was called to order at 7:01 p.m. After some discussion K. Winright moved to keep the 2021 tax milage rate the same as 2020 at 12.7533 not the 12.5135 that was requested by Eaton County, seconded by D. Swartz. Motion carried. Special Meeting was adjourned at 7:09 p.m.

Public Comment – Kayla Whitmer was here from the Bellevue Athletic Boosters and requested to use Washington Park and to shut down the necessary streets for the street dance/beer tent/cornhole and the car show on July 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup>. They would also like us to let them play live music until 11 p.m. on July 9<sup>th</sup> and then play DJ'ed music until midnight. T. Davis motioned to grant the requested items listed here and to give a \$400 sponsorship, seconded by R. Miller. Motion carried.

T. Davis moved to approve the Agenda for the May 25, 2021 council meeting, seconded by D. Swartz. Motion carried.

R. Miller moved to approve the minutes from the May 11th, 2021 council meeting, seconded by H. Coy. Motion carried.

D. Swartz moved that the Village pay the invoices for May 25, 2021, seconded by H. Coy. Motion carried.

N. Roberts gave the council an update on the house at 304 W. Jackson St. The outstanding water/sewer bill will be added to the Village of Bellevue Summer Taxes on June 20<sup>th</sup>, 2021.

Brad Lyons from Wightman came to the meeting to give and discuss the recommendations for the WWTP. Each member was given a packet to read over and we will discuss further in the upcoming month.

The zoning ordinance for the Light Industrial District was briefly discussed and the members believe that some changes need to be made to draw more light industrial businesses into Village limits. It was decided to have the Planning Commission talked about it at their next meeting to see if they can come up with some recommended changes.

D. Swartz moved to accept a resolution that states we are applying for a 50/50 match grant to repave E. Jefferson St. and Madison St. This will include replacing any water and sanitary sewer under Jefferson St. that is in need of replacing. The total cost to the Village will be \$387,500 and the State will cover \$209,650 and then on top of that the Village will cover the cost of putting in storm sewer on both streets, seconded by H. Coy. K. Winright abstained. Motion carried.

H. Coy moved to approve a resolution to have Dixon Engineering use a HOV to inspect the inside of the water tower and do a normal inspection on the outside for a total cost of \$4,200, seconded by D. Swartz. Motion carried.

R. Miller moved to have all council members to be paid for attending special meetings (outside of the normal council meeting times), seconded by K. Winright. Roll call vote: H. Coy – yay, T. Davis – yay, R. Miller – yay, K. Winright – yay, D. Swartz – nay, M. Goodrich – nay.

N. Roberts informed the council that the motion that was made at the last meeting to waive M. Goodrich's blight ticket is null and void. By law the only person that can waive the ticket is the officer that wrote it or the court.

R. Miller moved to adjourn the meeting at 9:13 p.m., seconded by H. Coy. Motion carried.
